St. Michael School, through many spiritual activities, has guided our students, faculty, and families to use Lent as a time to deepen their relationship with the Lord and be spiritually prepared for the Easter celebration.

Our Ash Wednesday mass marked the beginning of the Lenten Season. Our students, faculty, and family members received ashes, to signify we are sinners and that Jesus is our savior. It was a beautiful way to start our Lenten journey. Lent is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting, which prepares us for Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

During the Lenten season, we are called to prayer. Through our **Lenten Prayer Egg Project**, St. Michael students and faculty

are encouraged to pray daily for other students and faculty members. Each day, the classes pick an egg and pray for the person whose name is in it. They then send them a spiritual prayer card letting them know that they were prayed for that day. Each prayer card was designed by one of our talented 8th grade art students.



As we continued on our journey through Lent, we were blessed to have **Mr. John Angotti visit** our campus and offer our students mini-retreats.

He brought the love of Jesus to our students through song and spiritual talks. The students celebrated their faith by singing, worshipping, and coming together as one. St. Michael Church Parish also held their Lenten Mission, with Mr. John as the presenter. St. Michael School students and faculty were also encouraged to attend this uplifting and spiritual Mission.
